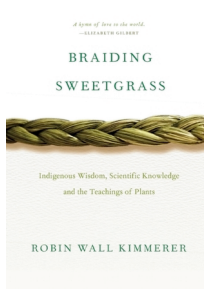
Gather by Kenneth M. Cadow
A resourceful teenager in rural Vermont struggles to hold on to the family home while his mom recovers from addiction.



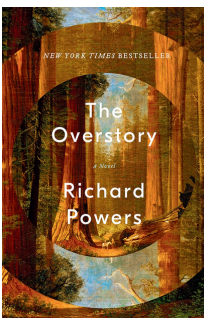
Birnam Wood by Eleanor Catton

A teen girl's dream job aboard a luxury train derails when she discovers the strange cargo being transported—a mysterious and beautiful greenhouse.



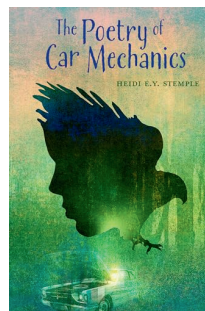
Braiding Sweetgrass by Robin Wall Kimmerer
The awakening of a wider ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgment and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world.



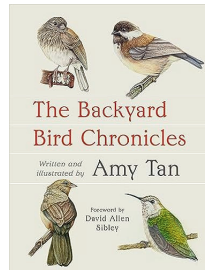
The Overstory by Richard Powers

The Backyard Bird Chronicles maps the passage of time through daily entries, thoughtful questions, and beautiful original sketches.

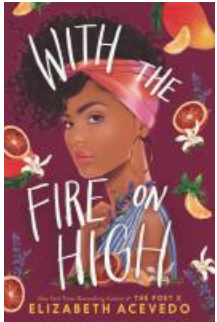


Bianca Torre Is Afraid of Everything by Justine Pucella Winans

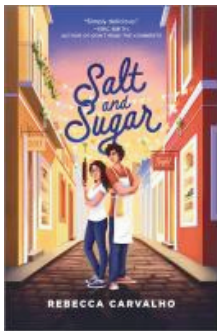

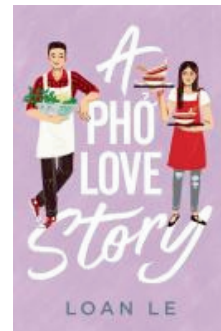
The Dos and Donuts of Love by Adiba Jaigirdar

An academics-obsessed teen learns big truths about love, family, and herself when a scheduling snafu lands her in a culinary arts class.

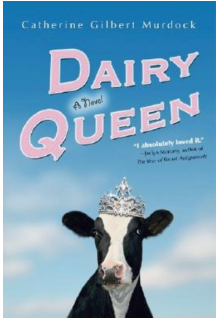

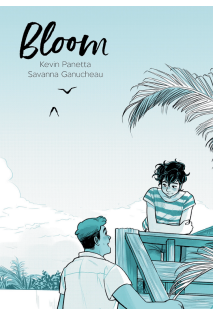

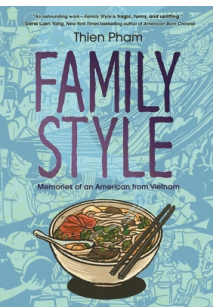
Dairy Queen by Catherine Gilbert Murdock
After spending her summer running the family farm and training the quarterback for her school's rival football team, sixteen-year-old D.J. decides to go out for the sport herself.



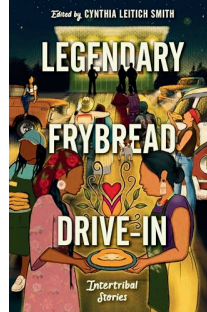
Bloom by Kevin Panetta

A Korean American teen tries to balance her dream to become a chef with the cultural expectations of her family when she enters the competitive world of a TV cooking show.



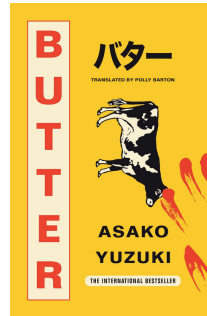
Family Style: Memories of an American from Vietnam by Thien Pham
